Text 1. Read the text below and answer the following questions.

The Suez Canal Blockage: A Tale of a Stuck Ship

In March 2021, the world was captivated by an extraordinary event that unfolded in the Suez Canal, one of the busiest waterways on the planet. A massive container ship named the Ever Given, became lodged sideways in the canal, halting maritime traffic and causing a global disruption in trade.

The Suez Canal, located in Egypt, serves as a vital link between the Mediterranean Sea and the Red Sea, providing a shortcut for ships traveling between Europe and Asia. It is approximately 120 miles long and allows vessels to avoid the lengthy and often perilous journey around the southern tip of Africa. The Suez Canal, one of the world's most important trading routes, was opened in 1869. By 2021, approximately fifty ships per day travelled through the canal, about 12 percent of total global trade at the time. For much of its length, however, the canal is not wide enough to allow two ships to pass each other; convoys of ships must take turns transiting these segments of the waterway. An expansion project is underway, but significant portions of the canal remain single-laned.

The Ever Given, operated by the Evergreen Marine Corporation, is one of the largest container ships in the world, measuring over 1,300 feet in length and capable of carrying thousands of containers. On March 23, 2021, while navigating through the Suez Canal, the ship encountered strong winds and a sandstorm, which caused it to turn off course and become stuck diagonally across the canal. Before the incident, Ever Given had sailed through the canal 22 times. The captain, Bill Kavanagh, has described sailing through the Suez Canal as "a very complex and high-risk operation". Wind gusts will cause the stacked containers to "act like a sail" to blow the heavy ship off course, and its enormous momentum makes it difficult to recover.

The blockage of the Suez Canal quickly became a global spectacle, as images and videos of the massive vessel wedged in the narrow waterway circulated across the internet. Efforts to dislodge the ship proved to be challenging, as its immense size and weight presented significant obstacles. The incident had immediate effects on global trade. The Suez Canal is a crucial channel for maritime shipping, accounting for around 12% of the world's trade volume. With the Ever Given blocking the canal, hundreds of ships were unable to pass through, leading to a backlog of vessels waiting at either end of the waterway. The disruption caused by the blockage echoed throughout the global economy. Supply chains were disrupted, and delays in the delivery of goods were experienced worldwide. Industries reliant on just-in-time delivery systems, such as manufacturing and retail, were particularly affected by the blockage in the Suez Canal.

Efforts to refloat the Ever Given and reopen the canal were met with urgency by the global community. A team of tugboats, dredgers, and excavators worked tirelessly to free the ship from its predicament. As days passed with the vessel still stuck, concerns grew about the potential long-term impacts of the blockage on global trade and the economy. After nearly a week of intensive efforts, the Ever Given was finally refloated on March 29, 2021. The successful operation was met with relief and celebration around the world, as maritime traffic resumed its course through the Suez Canal.

The incident served as a stark reminder of the vulnerabilities inherent in the global supply chain. While the blockage of the Suez Canal was eventually resolved, it highlighted the risks posed by unexpected events and the importance of contingency planning in ensuring the smooth flow of trade. The Suez Canal blockage of 2021 was a momentous event that captured the world's attention and disrupted global trade. The incident underscored the significance of the Suez Canal as a vital artery for maritime shipping and emphasized the need for resilience and adaptability in the face of unforeseen challenges.
