Passage 2

The Life Cycle of a Butterfly

Butterflies are beautiful insects that go through an interesting life cycle. This life cycle is called metamorphosis and includes four stages: egg, larva, pupa, and adult.

The life cycle starts with an egg laid on a plant by a female butterfly. The egg is usually small and round. After a few days or weeks, the egg hatches, and a tiny caterpillar, also known as a larva, emerges. The caterpillar eats leaves and grows quickly.

When the caterpillar is fully grown, it forms a pupa, which is often called a chrysalis. The pupa is a protective shell where the caterpillar faces a clear change. Inside the pupa, the caterpillar's body breaks down and reforms into a butterfly.

Finally, the butterfly appears from the chrysalis. Its wings are wet and broken up, but they soon dry and develop. The butterfly is now ready to fly and lay eggs, starting the cycle all over again.
