An Extraordinary Scientist

Paragraph 1

Young Saudi Arabian student Hayat Sindi had a dream. She wanted to become a great inventor. She wanted to improve health care for all. Her challenge was to get the right education. When she was a high school student, she decided that she needed to study in England. At first, her parents said no, but Sindi was an excellent student. Finally, her parents agreed.

When Sindi arrived in England at the age of 16, she spoke very little English. Her first year in England was not easy. She studied English and watched hours of television every day. Slowly, her English improved.

Paragraph 3

Her next big challenge was to enter a university program. For 12 months, she studied for the university entrance exams—all in English. After that year, she took the exams and passed. Sindi became a student at King's College London. She graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree. After that, she studied at the University of Cambridge. It was a difficult challenge. Some professors didn't believe a Saudi Arabian woman could succeed. But she continued to work hard. She was the first Saudi woman to receive a PhD in biotechnology from the University of Cambridge.

The invention is a very small piece of paper with special chemicals. When a nurse puts a drop of blood on the paper, the chemicals change colors. The nurse can quickly look at the colors and read the results. Before this invention, patients waited weeks for results. Often, patients never had a lab test.
